Education Specialist Credential in Mild/Moderate Disabilities
LEVEL I

After completion of the Level I credential, candidates are eligible to take teaching positions. Following employment as a special education teacher, candidates have 5 years to complete the Level II Professional Credential.

* Courses in this column are available to upper division undergraduate students.

** Not required for candidates who possess a Multiple Subjects Teaching credential. Individuals who acquired their Multiple Subjects Credential as an added authorization to an existing Single Subject or other California teaching credential **are required** to take these classes or submit substitution forms proving course of a similar content was successfully completed at another institution.

Not required for candidates who possess a Multiple or Single Subjects credential inclusive of CLAD or EL authorization.

Note: Candidates for the Level I credential must demonstrate knowledge of principles and provisions of U.S. Constitution through successful completion of a 3-unit college level course or examination. For further clarification contact the Credentials Office at 594-6320.
